This matter is before the North Carolina Medical Board (hereafter "Board") on the application of Tyler Ira Freeman, M.D. (hereafter Dr. Freeman) for reinstatement of his license to practice medicine and surgery previously issued by the Board. Dr. Freeman admits and the Board finds and concludes that:

Whereas, on December 1, 1981, the Board issued Dr. Freeman a license to practice medicine and surgery, license number 25706; and

Whereas, from 2002 to April 2005, Dr. Freeman was employed as the medical director of NeoGenesis Life Extension Medicine (hereafter "NeoGenesis"), in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Whereas, the Board indefinitely suspended Dr. Freeman's medical license on October 19, 2005. While he was medical director at NeoGenesis, Dr. Freeman allowed someone who was not a physician to perform chelation therapy and medical acts on patients and issue prescription medications to patients in Dr. Freeman's name without Dr. Freeman ever examining the patients

or establishing a physician-patient relationship with the patients.

Whereas, Dr. Freeman met with members of the Board for an informal interview in January 2007 to discuss the reinstatement of his medical license; and

Whereas, Dr. Freeman has taken steps and has agreed to take further steps to ensure the Board and the people of North Carolina that he will be able to safely practice medicine; and

Whereas, the Board has determined that it is in the public interest to resolve this case as set forth below.

Now, therefore, with Dr. Freeman's consent, it is ORDERED that:

1. The Board shall issue Dr. Freeman a full and unrestricted license to practice medicine.

2. Dr. Freeman shall meet with members of the Board for an informal interview at the Board's May 2007 meeting, and at any other times requested by the Board.

3. Dr. Freeman shall provide confirmation of his current continuing medical education credits to the members of the Board at his informal interview in May 2007.

4. Dr. Freeman shall take the utmost care to ensure that any employment he secures or investment in which he participates complies with all state and federal laws, and all rules regarding the practice of medicine.

5. Dr. Freeman intends to work for "Global Labs" as a Certified Medical Review Officer, and to conduct disability evaluations for the State of North Carolina. Before beginning any employment other than the aforementioned two positions, Dr. Freeman shall obtain practice site approval from the Board President, which the President is under no obligation to give.

6. Dr. Freeman shall notify the Board in writing of any change in his residence or practice addresses within ten (10) days of the change.

7. The admissions and findings contained herein are intended solely for the purpose of resolving this case at hand or in connection with other matters before the Board involving Respondent.

8. The numbered paragraphs of this Consent Order supersede and take the place of those imposing any continuing obligation in any prior consent order except those regarding the public nature of such consent orders.

9. If Dr. Freeman fails to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Order, that failure shall constitute unprofessional conduct within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(6) and shall be grounds, after any required notice and hearing, for the Board to annul, suspend, or revoke his license or to deny any application he might make in the future or then have pending for a license.

10. This Consent Order shall take effect immediately upon its execution by both Dr. Freeman and the Board and it shall continue in effect until specifically ordered otherwise by the Board.

11. Dr. Freeman hereby waives any requirement under any law or rule that this Consent Order be served on him.

12. Upon execution by Dr. Freeman and the Board, this Consent Order shall become a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the North Carolina General Statutes and shall be subject to public inspection and dissemination pursuant to the provisions thereof. Additionally, it will be reported to persons, entities, agencies, and clearinghouses, as required and permitted by law, including, but not limited to the National Practitioner Data Bank and the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank.

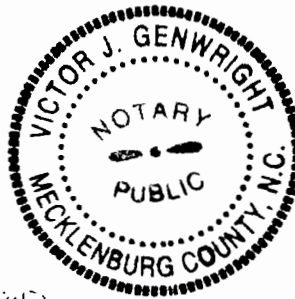
